You must enrol and vote if you are an Australian citizen aged 18 years or over.

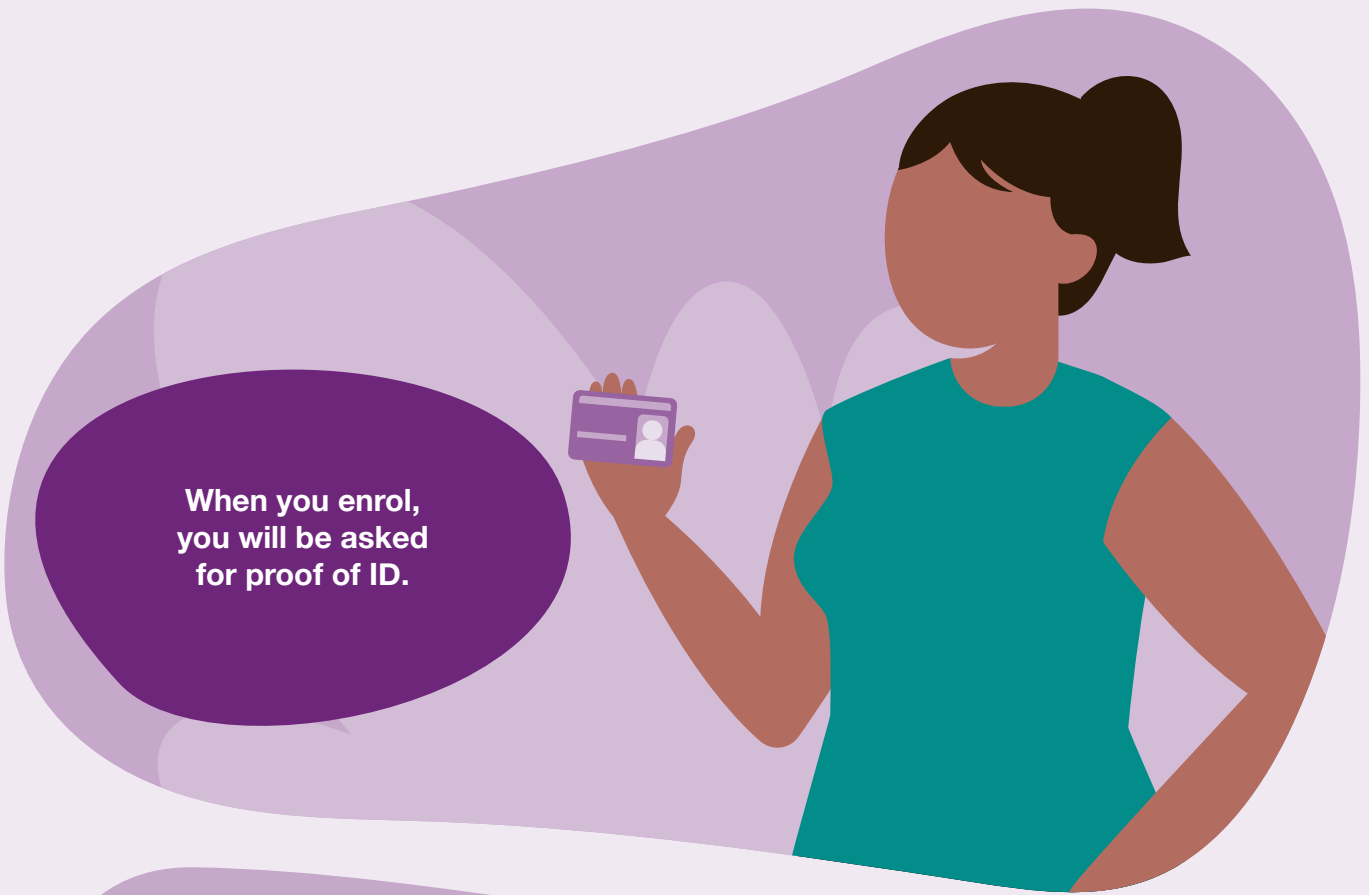
This list is called the Electoral Roll. To get your name on the Electoral Roll you can enrol online at the AEC website at aec.gov.au....

How do I enrol to vote in referendums and elections?



When you enrol, you will be asked for proof of ID.



This could be a driver's licence, Medicare card, passport, or someone who's already on the Electoral Roll who can confirm who you are.

If you want, you can ask someone to help you fill out the form.



Confirmation of electoral enrolment

A few weeks after you enrol, we will send you a letter. The letter will say that your name has been added to the Electoral Roll.



When your name is on the Electoral Roll, you must vote in referendums and elections.
