## In response to the Draft plans to abolish the federal seat of North Sydney in the proposed 2024 NSW redistribution.

## To The NSW Redistribution Committee,

My name is Rosemary Churchley, I am a resident in the Federal seat of North Sydney. I was born and raised in the North Sydney electorate and am currently raising a family of my own in the area. I also work in the North Sydney area, feeling a strong connection to the communities and families here.

I want to do all that I can to save the seat of North Sydney and ensure that I and the next generation of voters has a representative that is local—that truly understands who we are as a community and what issues are affecting us day to day. I am extremely displeased with the proposed division of our local community, and the changes that you are proposing will see our suburbs fall into districts that do not reflect the needs of our population and businesses. Our Lower North Shore communities are very close, sharing much in common and you your idea will break us apart, dividing up communities and business for no gain.

To give you an idea of the ridiculousness of the proposed mapping, my daughter, Rachel, proudly represents North Sydney in our community's netball competition. The teams she plays against include Willoughby, Cammeraygal, Chatswood, Lane Cove, Kirribilli, Northbridge, Roseville, and Mosman. A s a former netball representative myself, I know that the girls don't just play against these teams, they build lifelong friendships, friendly rivalries, and us the families congregate on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings to connect, bond, and discuss local happenings.

Your proposal aims to divide all of these areas, some moving into the Warringah seat, some Bradfield, others Bennelong. To give an example, the Northern Beaches Link development is one that the people of North Sydney vehemently opposed and with support of our federal representative the environmental, community and traffic impact was considered. I am also disappointed that we were not previously involved in this draft proposal earlier, only informed about it mere weeks ago.
